Without pregame equipment checks from umpires, some teams continued to use white-barrel bats. Until the rule is enforced by umpires, the rule serves no purpose. We experienced teams using white-barrel bats during the regional tournament. Our players continued to abide by the rules, but the other teams were allowed to continue using these bats

What is the proposed wording for the new/modified rule?: Effective starting the 2021-2022 season, white-barrel BBCOR certified bats are now legal.

Describe the change you would like to see with this rule: We would like to eliminate the age-component in rule 7.08.0. We find it to be ineffective and needlessly discriminatory; rules 7.04.0 and 7.05.0 are far more effective at policing skill disparities by disqualifying players on the basis of professional and collegiate experience rather than age.

What was the reason you would like to see this rule modified, added, or removed?: It is imperative that rule 7.08.0 be modified because its current application fails to achieve its intended purpose, therefore resulting in an unjust practice of age-based discrimination.

Though not explicitly stated, an individual can reasonably conclude that rule 7.08.0 was implemented to create a 'level playing-field' of competition amongst NCBA players. While the requirement of "Full-Time Status" ensures that student-athletes are indeed only competing against fellow student-athletes (a qualifier that all parties can agree is necessary for fair play), the 25-year-old age limit is arbitrary and baseless. Simply put, age does not equate to baseball ability. If it did, "19% of players taken in the first 10 rounds of the [2019 MLB Draft would not have been] high schoolers," and the likes of Don Mattingly, Jose Canseco, Hank Aaron, Willie Mays, Mike Trout, and Bryce Harper would not have won the MLB MVP award before each of their own respective 25th birthdays (Diamond & McGinty, 2019; Getz, 2011; "MLB Awards," n.d.). Studies show that what matters most is experience (Schulz et al., 1994, pp. 274-286). As detailed in Psychology and Aging (a respected scholarly journal), for "persons who do not achieve world-class levels of performance" (i.e., NCBA players), peak levels often occur after the "optimal physiological age," which the Journal of Sports Sciences finds to be 29 (Schulz et al., 1994, pp. 286; Bradbury, 2009, [Abstract]). What accounts for postphysiological-peak development is playing experience (Schulz et al., 1994, [Figure 8]). For this reason, we argue that the 25-year-old age limit fails on all levels to create a 'level playing-field,' rendering it useless; rules 7.04.0 and 7.05.0 actually regulate baseball experience, and are thus sufficient measures for promoting equal competition.

In addition to its lack of utility, rule 7.08.0's age limit is incredibly discriminatory. Approximately 32.4% of San Jose State University students are 25-years-old or older (College Factual, 2021). This means that about 11,600 students are prohibited from competing in the NCBA for no reason other than their age, which has already been proven to be of no personal advantage. Such discrimination is unacceptable and runs contradictory to the NCBA's mission of "[providing] collegiate student-athletes with the opportunity to play competitive, organized college baseball," (NCBA, 2008).

We kindly ask that the representatives of the NCBA fulfill the organization's promise of "commitment, dedication, and understanding," and consider abolishing the age limit from rule 7.08.0 (NCBA, 2008). We thank you for your time and consideration.

What is the proposed wording for the new/modified rule?: Any player playing in a NCBA Sanctioned Baseball Game MUST have enrolled with Full-Time Status.

REMOVING NCBA RULE 7.08.0, "ANY PLAYER PLAYING IN A NCBA SANCTIONED BASEBALL GAME MUST HAVE ENROLLED WITH FULL-TIME STATUS BEFORE THEIR 25^{TH} BIRTHDAY

DOES NOT PASS: 5 VOTES TO 2 VOTES

MOVING THE AGE FROM 25 YEARS OLD TO 26 YEARS OLD IN NCBA RULE 7.08.0

PASSES: 5 VOTES TO 2 VOTES

KEEP RULE UNIFORM ACROSS ALL DIVISIONS

PASSES: 6 VOTES TO 1 VOTE

Describe the change you would like to see with this rule: We would like rule 7.09.0 to be eliminated, as we believe that the six year time-clock (beginning from initial enrollment of full-time status) has a disparate impact against athletes who experience economic hardship.

What was the reason you would like to see this rule modified, added, or removed?: Rule 7.09.0 should be removed because it wrongly penalizes students who experience economic hardship. I know this to be true, because I myself have been negatively impacted.

In the spring of 2013, I was enrolled with full-time status at Fullerton College. However, after one of my parents lost their jobs I was forced to withdraw from the institution. Because of rule 7.09.0, my six-year time clock had begun, but clearly I was not in a position to play. After working for a few months, I was finally able to re-enroll at the college; but since I was now putting myself through school, I could only afford a few units a semester (i.e. part-time status). Nevertheless, my time-clock continued to tick. It wasn't until my second year after transferring to San Jose State that I was finally financially stable enough to participate in extracurriculars, such as club baseball (might I also add that it was the first time that I was at an institution with an NCBA team). And then Covid-19 happened...

In spring 2021, I graduated with my bachelor's degree in Child Development/Prep for Teaching. I am returning in this fall to begin a two-year credentials and master's program. This would be the first time in my college career that I would hypothetically be able to play, EXCEPT my time-clock has expired.

I find this to be extremely frustrating, as I won't be eligible to play due to a technicality (which doesn't even align with the intent of the rule). The purpose of rule 7.09.0 is to prevent career players (or students who intentionally postpone college graduation in order to compete in additional baseball seasons) from participating in the NCBA. The problem is that the six-year time clock doesn't actually contribute to the success of the rule. The determining factor between a career player and a student-athlete is based in economic theory. The average cost to compete in the Men's Senior Baseball League is \$15 per game (MSBL/MABL, n.d.); just to be eligible to compete in the NCBA, an individual must enroll with full-time status, which has an average (instate) cost of \$9,580 (Hanson, 2021). No sane person is going to spend thousands of dollars to compete when they can do so for literally a fraction of the cost. Thus, rule 7.09.0 is a completely unnecessary piece of regulation.

In summary, individuals like myself are impacted by rule 7.09.0 due to the burden of having to work while attending university. Some may enroll as a full-time student, but then have life changing events, forcing them to limit their course workload and balance out their responsibilities. In these cases, the students' enrollment may be prolonged past the 6 years stated in the rule. But why should they be penalized? Why should they be subjected to treatment that individuals who are more economically well-off are not? The NCBA is an

organization of inclusivity, and eliminating rule 7.09.0 would help it live up to this principle.

What is the proposed wording for the new/modified rule?: *If rule 7.09.0 cannot be removed, could the representatives of the NCBA please consider altering the rule to be worded as follows: "Each student-athlete shall complete his five seasons of participation in intercollegiate baseball within six calendar years from the beginning of the semester or quarter in which the student-athlete first registered with the NCBA."

A defensive substitution cannot be made unless the team wanting to make the substitution is playing defense at the time.
